I retired as a Federal firefighter in 2002 and was recruited by Training Resources Limited, Inc. to teach shipboard firefighting at their facility in Point Loma. The CTE Maritime Academy at Mar Vista High School was just starting up (in January of 2002) and they asked me to take over the program as site coordinator; I assumed the role in March of 2002.

To date, we have had over 1,200 students participate in the classroom training at Mar Vista. Approximately 200 students have participated in the Military Sealift Command (MSC) Summer Internship Program, living and working aboard MSC ships for 6 to 8 weeks. This is a testament to the initiative of the students. I estimate that over one hundred students have gone on to work for maritime companies. One student who graduated in 2003 walked into my office and talked with me about his working for Chevron for the past six years. Because of this job, he had saved up enough money to put 50% down on a house in San Diego for his family, a proud moment indeed.

Part of what makes our program unique is that we bring real world training to our students. We show the students that there are opportunities after graduation and we help them to get these jobs. Furthermore, we encourage every student to go on to college if they can. The Maritime program helps students to apply for professional mariner positions after graduation. These are very high paying jobs, for the most part. For instance, an entry level Ordinary Seaman working for the Military Sealift Command (civilians working for the Department of the Navy) can make over \$50,000 their first year. I believe that the CTE programs of study are extremely important at the high school level. As much as we want it to happen, not every student will be attending college after graduation. That being said, our program incorporates standards that enable our students to be both career-and-college ready.

Our program of study continues to thrive at Mar Vista, as evidenced by full classes every semester.
