In the case of our Medical Pathway, our students participate in an internship program with Scripps Hospital where students get hands on experience in the work place. Our Engineering students have participated in internships with SPAWAR and Qualcomm.

It also prepares them for their future careers. Last semester a student had just learned CPR in the Physical Therapy class, and the following weekend had to put to practice this skill by conducting CPR on a community member and saving the student's life.

The Physical Therapy I course is important to the curriculum of the school because it gives students the opportunity to express their interest in the medical, therapeutic, and sports medicine fields through hands-on practical application. Their exposure to CPR/ First Aid awareness preparation, injury prevention, therapeutic rehabilitation, splinting and taping skills are exercises which go handin-hand with real-life scenarios. Athletes that have taken the course are utilizing specific rehabilitation techniques in response to their sports-related injury. Emergency Health Services (EHS) coaches have requested

my students to provide aid in injury prevention by splinting/taping athletes before and after sporting events. The students feel more valuable to the school serving as Student Athletic Trainers (S.A.T.'s). Student-athletes that have taken the course have realized that not all of them will continue their athletic careers at the collegiate level, and have concluded that Physical Therapy/Sports Medicine is the next best choice to being involved with a sport.

The Physical Therapy I course prepares students to develop a base for Sports Medicine-related college courses and career pathways. Students also learn basic medical terminology, human anatomy, CPR/First Aid, OSHA standards, and proper splinting and taping skills. The in-the-field environment allows students to develop individual skills through hands-on application with their peers.

A Program of Study is a student plan that involves a multi-year sequence of Career Technical Education courses that supports core academic knowledge, skills, concepts and content with technical and occupational skills. ...
